The following change is effective:

.0109 (e)(2) now reads: Materials which threaten inmate rehabilitation. In addition to maintaining security and custody of inmates and providing a work environment consistent with state and federal law and policy, the Division is charged with the rehabilitation of inmates. Rehabilitation includes but is not limited to the acquisition of appropriate personal and social skills and responses, and the acquiring of self-control. As a result, all materials specified above are also considered to be a threat to inmate rehabilitation. In addition, pictorial materials which depict exposed, **full frontal view** of uncovered human genitalia or the female breast are specifically deemed to be a threat to institutional order, security and safety and a threat to inmate rehabilitation and are prohibited. This prohibition shall not apply to patently medical, artistic, anthropological or educational commercial publications, including but not limited to *National Geographic*, works of art displayed in public galleries, i.e., **ArtNews**, anatomy texts or comparable materials.
